Later Once again our principal reminded the UGC Norms of the 'Anti-Ragging' to the students, since they all have come to REGULAR COLLEGE after the locked down. The present batch student doesn't have an idea of Anti- Ragging, because this batch has come to college after COVID-19. Anti-Ragging Rules follows:

Depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely:

1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
2. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits. 3. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
4. Withholding results.
5. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
6. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
7. Cancellation of admission.
8. Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.

9. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period. Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment

All the Head of the Departments were incharge and leaders of Anti-ragging committee. The students can utilize them for anri-ragging campus.




